Sir

I was duly honoured with your letter of the 15th instant enclosing me copies of the Bye Laws of the Municipality of Pittsburgh on the subject of Tavern licences and requesting my opinion as to what proceedings the Township Council could take against the Inspectors of Houses of Public Entertainment for refusing to grant certificates under the Statute of 1850 to three of the persons named in the Bye Law of the 23rd February 1852.

In reply I beg to state that in my opinion the Council exceeded its powers when it named in its Bye Law the persons who ~~could be licensed~~ during the year - it has the right to limit the number of Houses of Public Entertainment - to establish regulations for their good government &c. but when this is done the individuals desiring licences and alleging that they have complied and will comply with the Bye Laws of the Council must go to the Inspectors for certificates and the discretion as to the individuals is with the Inspectors - I do not therefore think that the Council can compel the Inspectors to grant certificates to the persons mentioned in their Bye Law or punish them for not doing so -
