

It is very remarkable, that the City was not disturbed by any Riot or Mob, as is common on such Occasions, but the whole was begun, continued and ended, to the universal Satisfaction of the Inhabitants. A large Quantity of Wood was given for a Bonfire, and many Barrels of Beer to the Populace. And-Yesterday the principal Inhabitants gave an elegant Entertaiment at the State-House, at which his Honour the GOVERNOR, and the Officers of Government; the Military Gentlemen, Captain HAWKER, of his Majesty's Ship Sardine, the other Gentlemen of the Navy, and the Strangers in the City, were present. The Honours of the Table were performed by the Worshipful Mayor of the City, assisted by some of the Aldermen; and, considering that not less than Three Hundred Plates were laid, the whole was conducted with the greatest Elegance and Decorum; so that Detraction itself must be silent on the Occasion. In a Letter from Barbados, dated April 28, it is said, that a Packet, from England, was arrived there, in five Weeks Passage, which brought an Account of the Repeal of the Stamp Act; and that in a Speech made by His Majesty, at the Repealing of that Law, He was most graciously pleased to declare, "That could He have conceived the Act would have been so injurious and disagreeable to His Subjects, He never would have given his Assent to it; therefore most cheerfully repealed it."

The Right Honourable Lord Viscount KILLMOREY has appointed the Rev. NATHANIEL EVANS, M. A. Missionary for Gloucester County, in New-Jersey, his Lordship's Chaplain.

Captain Brownlow, from Barbados, on the First Instant, in Lat. 27: 30, Long: 64: 54, spoke a Sloop, Captain Bascome, from St. Croix for Bermuda, who had some Negroes on board, belonging to the Vessels that were taken by the Spaniards at Saltertuda, who jumped overboard, when they were taken, and swam ashore, in attempting which, several were drowned.

Captain M^r Cutcheon, from Liverpool, on the 15th of March, in Lat. 49. Long 10: 30, spoke the Ship Pitt, Captain Aylesworth, from Antigua for Rotterdam, who had been out nine Weeks, and was in great Want of Provisions, which he supplied them with. Captain M^r Cutcheon, on the First of April, in a hard Gale of Wind, sprang his Boltsprit.

Captain Wainwright, from Turks-Island, on the Tenth Instant, in Lat. 36, Long. 73: 40, parted with Captain Wood, who sailed in Company with him, bound to Virginia.—On Wednesday, the Fourteenth Instant, about twelve at Night, a little below Marcus-Hook, Captain Wainwright took the Owner (Mr. Hough) another Man, a Boy, three Women, and a Girl, out of a Shallop then lying at Anchor, from Port Penn, loaded with Timber, that had been run down by a Schooner going down the River, by which she received so much Damage, that she could not be kept above Water. Just after he got them on board, a very heavy Squall of Wind and Rain came on, and next Morning the Shallop was drove on a Bank on the Jersey Shore.

Capt. Wise, from Poole, on the 12th Instant, in Lat. 38: 58, about 70 Leagues to the Eastward, spoke Capt. Long, from this Place, bound to Lisbon.
