I DO, therefore, by their Presents, require the Council, constituted by the A !, entitled, "An Act to provide " for the temporary Government of " the Southern Parts of this State, " whenever the Enemy shall abandon or be dispossessed of the same, and until the Legislature can be con-vened," passed the Twenty-third Day of October, 1779; to meet at Guion's Favern, at had-Chefter, in the County of Welt-Chefter, on the faid twenty-first Instants of which the feveral Members, composing the faid Council, will take Notice, and give their Attendance accordingly: AND
